Oakfield Park;

Is one of Donegal's best loved attractions. Beautiful award-winning parkland, woodlands, lakes and formal gardens that have everything you need to entertain the whole family. Spend hours exploring the grounds at your leisure from walled gardens to ponds, lakes, and a lakeside nymphaeum, hedge maze, heritage trees and sculptures. Children can make a wish at Oakfield Parks Faerie tree while navigating their way through adventures on extensive walks and trails. Their crowning glory is a 4.5km narrow gauge railway with diesel and stream train operating passenger trips daily. This is a magical way to explore the park's gardens as the train passes through flower meadows, beautiful woodlands, willow tunnels, oak circles, boardwalks, heritage trees, a wooden causeway and sparkling streams and lakes. *All guests can avail of a 10% discount off entry into Oakfield Park by presenting their hotel key card on arrival*

Visitor Attractions

Donegal County Museum;

Erected to collect, record, preserve, communicate and display the history of Donegal. Located within close walking distance of the Hotel. The Museum was opened in 1987 and the building once formed part of the town's Workhouse which was established for the relief of the poor during the great Famine, it opened in 1843 and operated until 1922. The museum houses many items of local historical importance including artefacts dating from the Stone Age and objects relating to the history and folk life of the County.



Visitor Attractions Continued

Glenveagh National Park;

A 20 minutes' scenic drive from the Station House Hotel Letterkenny and tucked in close to the Derryveagh Mountains is a remote and an impressively stunning wilderness of rugged mountains, unspoiled lakes and beautiful waterfalls. This magnificent national park is the second largest park in Ireland and is set on acres of natural habitat and jaw dropping manicured gardens. There is a deer sanctuary on site, the Golden Eagle to meet visitors. It's absolutely stunning! Guided tours of the castle are available at allocated times: www.glenveaghnationalpark.ie Family events are organised for most weekends throughout the summer months and these include; children story time, bird of prey display, medieval weaponry display and more.

Ards Forest Park;

The park covers approximately 480 hectares (1200 acres) and includes a variety of habitats, among them sand dunes, beaches, salt marshes, salt water lakes, rock face and, of course, coniferous and deciduous woodlands. With such a variety of landscapes, it is possible to spend many hours exploring this wonderful park. The sea is one of the real treasures of this forest park and there are several trails, the Binngorm trail, the Salt Marsh Trail and the Sand Dune Trail, which offer the hiker an opportunity to experience it in all its facets. There are a large number of trails in this park giving the walker the opportunity to explore a variety of habitats from foreshore and sand dunes to semi natural oak woodlands on rock outcrops. By "stitching together" a number of trails, it is possible to hike for 5/6 hours on forest tracks and trails, taking in the full circuit of the park. The park is also home to a wide selection of animals and birds and the special hide at the end of the salt marsh trail allows the visitor to watch their winter visitors feed on the salt marsh. For those interested in human history, there are a number of historical and archaeological features. There are the remains of four ring forts together with a holy well and a mass rock.

Fort Dunree;

In Bunrana, County Donegal, a military museum giving special emphasis on coastal artillery and military history. During World War II Irish forces were stationed at Fort Dunree to prevent the warring nations violating the country's neutrality. Fort Dunree houses a fascinating display of military memorabilia, large guns and artefacts from the 20th century. Fort Dunree is also rich in wildlife and this is detailed in the Wildlife discovery room in the Saldanha suite.

Newmills Corn and Flax Mills;

are on the Glenties Road out of Letterkenny in a pleasant setting by River Swilly. They have the largest working waterwheels in Ireland. It was made by 1867, it closed in 1982 and much of the old machinery is still present.



Visitor Attractions Continued

The Inishowen Maritime Museum;

Inishowen Maritime Museum & Planetarium is conveniently housed in the old coastguard station, only 100 yards from the Lough Foyle ferry landing at Greencastle, County Donegal. Enjoy the displays of all things relating to the sea, stars and more in the museum with its full dome planetarium theatre. Inishowen Maritime Museum & Planetarium, Greencastle, County Donegal, has an extensive collection of artefacts, exhibitions and memorabilia of all things maritime. You will see fascinating displays about shipwrecks, traditional boat building, fishing, emigration, WWI and WWII sea battles, coastguards, master mariners, basking sharks and more.

Glebe House and Gallery;

The home for nearly thirty years of the renowned artist Derek Hill, is situated on rising ground, beside Lough Gartan, east of Glenveagh National Park, Co. Donegal. Originally known as St. Columba's, the 1828 Regency-style house is decorated with William Morris textiles, and collections of Islamic and Japanese art, as well as 300 works by leading twentieth-century artists such as Picasso and Kokoshka. The house and gardens are displayed in an informal manner, as though Derek Hill was still in residence. Glebe House and Gallery are operated and managed by the Office of Public Works

Colmcille Heritage Centre;

Located at Gartan, Letterkenny. The centre exhibition featuring the life and times of Saint Colmcille (Columba) – Patriarch of the Irish monastic system and founder of the Scottish Church. The centre is located in a beautiful Stone building on the shores of Lough Gartan, within the Derryveagh Mountain range.

Ramelton;

Built between 1609-1622, Ramelton is one of the earliest Plantation towns in the county. Picturesque heritage village. Donegal Ancestry Centre which is the official family history research centre for Donegal is located here. It was established to assist people trace their Donegal ancestors

Portsalon;

Popular tourist attraction with its 18-hole Golf Course. Ballmastoker Bay Beach is also known as Portsalon Beach. This is a truly spectacular Blue Flag beach located on the Fanad Peninsula in the north county Donegal. It was once voted the 2nd most beautiful beach in the world. It is located on the western side of the Lough Swilly between Rathmullan and Fanad Head and as fabulous views of the Inishowen Peninsula. The best views can be best seen from the viewpoint above Knockalla coast drive.

Fanad Lighthouse;

Is an iconic working lighthouse standing between idyllic Lough Swilly and Mulroy Bay. Fanad Lighthouse has been voted one of the most beautiful lighthouses in the world. This stunning heritage building is the flagship visitor attraction of the Fanad peninsula, an area of outstanding natural beauty which has much to offer the visitor.



Visitor Attractions Continued

The Inishowen Peninsula;

Has some of the finest scenery in Ireland, located within a half-hour drive of Letterkenny. The heritage trail begins **At Grianan an Aileach** – the ancient Temple of the Sun Christianised by St. Patrick. Onwards to Buncrana and the **Tullyarvan Mill** – a restored corn mill dating from the nineteenth century and today developed as a local craft centre and tourist amenity. The Coast Road heading left at Buncrana **Dunree Head**, where stands **Fort Dunree. Wild Ireland** walk among ancient trees and encounter bears, wolves, lynx and wild boar together again in the Irish forest for the first time in thousands of years. Truly spectacular and perfect for a great family day out. Their beautiful lake is home to swans, ducks and even a pair of otters. They've also got a couple of cheeky Monkeys. Take a trail around the rainforest, be delighted with their tales of ancient folklore.

East of the peninsula on the of Lough Foyle is **Greencastle**, one of Ireland's most important fishing villages. **Malin Head** (unspoilt beauty!) Take a journey as far north as you can go, and you'll reach the edge of Europe – otherwise known as the wild, rugged and romantic Malin Head. The start (or end, depending on your point of view) of the Wild Atlantic Way, Malin Head has long been renowned for its epic coastal scenery, thriving birdlife and historical curiosities.

Rathmullan;

Boasts a Blue Flag Beach. Located near the harbour is centre home to the Flight of the Earls exhibition which illustrates life and times of the Earls, O' Neill and O'Donnell. East of the peninsula on the aftermath of their flight, which took place in 1607 at Rathmullan, marking a major milestone in the Irish struggle for independence from The English.

Doe Castle;

Is situated about 1 mile off the Carrigart to Creeslough Road. This MacSuibhne castle is protected on three sides by the sea, while on the landward side a moat has been hewn from the rock. Doe Castle sits deep in Sheephaven Bay, in a spectacular location on the shore near Creeslough village. It was a stronghold of the MacSweeney Clan who came to Donegal from Scotland as Gallowglasses (professional fighters).

Errigal Mountain;

Located in the West of Donegal near the Irish speaking parish called Gweedore and it is the tallest peak of the Derryveagh Mountains, the tallest peak in Co. Donegal and the 26th tallest peak in Ireland. Errigal is also the steepest and the highest of the mountain chain called the "Seven Sisters" by the locals. It is well renowned for the pinkish glow of its quartzite in the setting sun and its every changing shape depending on what direction you view it from.

Emergency Information

Fire and Safety;

Our Hotel is equipped with smoke detectors and fire extinguishers for your safety. The Safety of our guests is of immense importance to us...please take a few minutes to familiarise with procedures as outlined below:

Fire Alarm Test;

The fire alarms will be sounded at midday each Monday in order to test our system. We also conduct periodic fire drills for the safety of employees and hotel guests. Should a fire drill be scheduled during your stay, we shall inform you on check in

In the Event of a Fire;

Please do not open the windows. On the back of the bedroom you will find a fire evacuation plan, please familiarise yourself with the exact location of your room on the plan and note the nearest emergency exit. Should the fire alarm sound please exercise care and attention before vacating your room and leave in a timely but calm manner, closing the bedroom door behind you. ***PLEASE DO NOT USE THE LIFTS***

Please proceed to the Hotel's fire assembly point which is located in the car park to the rear of the hotel. Identify yourself to a Manager giving your name and room number DO NOT RE-ENTER...Please do not re-enter the building until a Hotel Manager or Fire Marshall directs you to do so.

Any guest(s) who are intoxicated and acting in a disruptive or aggressive manner in the Hotel will be asked to leave and no refunds will be offered.

Under no circumstances is any alcohol permitted to be brought into the hotel for consumption. Only alcohol purchased in the Bar in the hotel is allowed to be consumed on the premises

We operate a strict procedure in the event of any disturbances; whereby the Night porter will call to the room and ask for the noise levels to be kept down, should he need to call a second time you will be notified that unfortunately should there be any further incidents you will be asked to leave the Hotel without any refund.

The €50 deposit per room will also be required in cash on check in and will be refunded on check out as long as there have been no disturbances or damages. Where there has been an incident we will take the amount the damage or disturbance to other guest's amounts to.

Where the €50 cash deposit has not been provided, the credit card which secured the Booking will be liable to these charges.
